One that Understands Where it Stands (A committed church)

Matthew 7:24-29

Third in the series

Did you know that 26 of the 100 largest churches in America are just like us? They are Christian Churches and churches of Christ. Our fellowship of churches was forged in the same crucible as our nation. They began around 1800. In the latter part of the 1800's, Isaac Errett, editor of the *Christian Standard* magazine, realized a clear summation of the Restoration Movement was needed, both for members of the churches and for others wanting to know more about the Christian Churches and Churches of Christ.

To accomplish that task, he wrote "Our Position." In it he described:

- 1. Areas where most evangelical churches agree
- 2. Areas where many evangelical churches agree
- 3. Areas that have been historically unique

The need for a clear understanding of what makes us distinct is as critical today as it was in 1870's. Today more churches are gravitating in our direction. Some of the motivation of this certainly comes from our numerical success. But numbers without well-understood commitments will miss the bedrock of our faith. Let's be sure our lives—and this congregation—are well anchored to Jesus Christ.
